POSITION OBJECTIVES

The primary purpose of this position is to perform stream and riparian habitat restoration activities. The secondary purpose is to collect and enter hydrologic data relating to The Klamath Tribes' instream claims.

MAJOR DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Assist in implementation of stream and riparian habitat restoration projects.

2. Safely operate, maintain, and repair gear and equipment necessary for implementing stream and riparian habitat restoration projects.
3. Use a variety of equipment to collect hydrological field data from the Wood, Williamson, Sprague, and Sycan Rivers, and other areas as needed. Field sampling will frequently occur during adverse weather conditions.
4. Assist with entering, editing, updating, and graphing flow data, following established data entry and data QA/QC protocols.
5. Follow all QA/QC procedures for field sampling programs.
6. Assist in the research, monitoring, and evaluation of a wide variety of aquatic resources.
7. Like all employees of the Klamath Tribes, the incumbent will be called upon to accomplish other tasks that may not be directly related to this position, but are integral to the Klamath Tribes' broader functions, including but not limited to, assisting during Tribal sponsored cultural, traditional, or community events that enable the successful operation of programs and practices of The Klamath Tribes as aligned with The Klamath Tribes' Mission Statement. Some of these tasks may be scheduled outside of regular work hours, if necessary.

SUPERVISORY CONTROLS

The Aquatic Resources Technician I is directly supervised by the Aquatic Resources Technician III who provides general instructions regarding work schedule and protocols, and review of work products. The Aquatic Resources Technician I must be able to work collaboratively in a team environment as well as independently, using knowledge from training, experience, and instructions to ensure that duties and responsibilities are carried out in a safe, timely manner and that policy and procedures are followed. Work is reviewed for compliance with policy, procedures, and goal attainment.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES

Knowledge of, or willingness to learn, aquatic restoration methods for installation of instream structures, riparian planting, and riparian fencing.

Knowledge of, or willingness to learn, standard methods used to measure river flows and monitor related gauges to ensure accurate measurements.

Willingness to learn and follow procedures for data quality assurance and quality control (QA/QC).

Basic knowledge of Microsoft Office products.

Ability to effectively communicate both orally and in writing.

Basic knowledge and skills pertaining to power tools including chain saws.

Ability to collect and compile data accurately and efficiently while being detail oriented, thorough, and staying organized.

Ability to work outdoors, in extreme weather conditions for prolonged periods, during both day and night.

Knowledge of, or willingness to learn, field data entry protocols including unique data collection software and the ability to learn new software, as necessary.

Ability to perform tasks in stream environments which require lifting up to 50 lbs., to a height of approximately 4 ft., bending, hiking in rugged terrain while carrying sampling equipment, and prolonged standing.

Ability to safely navigate and operate: vehicles in adverse weather conditions (e.g. snowy roads) and on rugged forest roads; water craft (canoe, drift boat, jet boat, Boston Whaler, etc.) on rivers and lakes in challenging conditions (high winds, large waves, shallow water, etc.).

QUALIFICATIONS, EXPERIENCE, EDUCATION

Minimum Qualifications: *Failure to comply with minimum position requirements may result in termination of employment.*

- **REQUIRED** to possess a High School Diploma or Equivalent. *(Must submit copy of diploma or transcripts with application.)*
- **REQUIRED** to possess and maintain a valid Oregon Driver's License, (out of state applicants must receive ODL within 90 days of hire), have good driving record and be insurable by The Klamath Tribes' vehicle insurance policy. *(Must submit copy of driver license with application.)*
- **REQUIRED** to obtain an Oregon Boater Education Card within the initial 90-day probationary period as a condition of employment.
- **REQUIRED** to adhere to The Klamath Tribes Alcohol and Drug Free Workplace policy.
- **REQUIRED** to accept responsibility of a mandatory reporter in accordance with the Klamath Tribes Juvenile Ordinance Title 2, Chapter 15.64 and General Council Resolution #2005 003, all Tribal staff are considered mandatory reporters.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Prior experience in performing manual labor using hand tools and chain saws is preferred.

INDIAN PREFERENCE

- Indian and Tribal Preference will apply, as per policy. (*Must submit tribal documentation with application to qualify for Indian Preference*).
